Nature and purpose - Found

Article 28(3). The agreement describes both the nature and the purpose of the processing.

All 2 configured phrase groups were found together in the quoted passage.

Exact extracted excerpt: “support and account administration. The duration of processing is the term of this agreement. Types of personal data - Found

Article 28(3). The agreement identifies the types of personal data processed.

All 2 configured phrase groups were found together in the quoted passage.

Categories of data subjects - Found

Article 28(3). The agreement identifies the categories of people whose data is processed.

All 2 configured phrase groups were found together in the quoted passage.

Exact extracted excerpt: “storage, retrieval and deletion. The purpose of the processing is to provide the contracted support service. Controller rights and obligations - Found

Article 28(3). The agreement sets out the controller’s rights and obligations.

All 3 configured phrase groups were found together in the quoted passage.

Exact extracted excerpt: “storage, retrieval and deletion. The purpose of the processing is to provide the contracted support service. Documented instructions - Found

Article 28(3)(a). The processor is limited to the controller’s documented instructions, including for transfers.

All 3 configured phrase groups were found together in the quoted passage.

Matched evidence tests: processor action, documented instructions, controller or transfer.

Missing evidence tests: none.

Evidence 1. Paragraphs 3-4. coverage.

Exact extracted excerpt: “DOCUMENTED INSTRUCTIONS

The processor shall only process personal data on the documented instructions of the controller, including any transfer of personal data. If processing is required by applicable law, the processor shall inform the controller before processing unless such law prohibits that notice.”

Source IDs: UK-DPA-01, UK-DPA-02.

Mandatory-law exception and notice - Found

Article 28(3)(a). If UK law requires other processing, the processor informs the controller before processing unless the law prohibits notice.

All 3 configured phrase groups were found together in the quoted passage.

Matched evidence tests: legal requirement, advance notice, prohibition exception.

Missing evidence tests: none.

Evidence 1. Paragraphs 3-4. coverage.

Exact extracted excerpt: “DOCUMENTED INSTRUCTIONS

The processor shall only process personal data on the documented instructions of the controller, including any transfer of personal data. If processing is required by applicable law, the processor shall inform the controller before processing unless such law prohibits that notice.”

Confidentiality - Found

Article 28(3)(b). People authorised to process the data are committed to confidentiality or an appropriate statutory duty.

All 2 configured phrase groups were found together in the quoted passage.

Matched evidence tests: authorised people, confidentiality duty.

Missing evidence tests: none.

Evidence 1. Paragraphs 5-6. coverage.

Exact extracted excerpt: “CONFIDENTIALITY AND SECURITY

Persons authorised to process the personal data are bound by an appropriate duty of confidentiality. The processor shall implement appropriate technical and organisational measures required for the security of processing under Article 32, including measures supporting confidentiality, integrity and availability.”

Source IDs: UK-DPA-01, UK-DPA-02.

Security measures - Found

Article 28(3)(c); Article 32. The processor must apply the security measures required by Article 32.

All 3 configured phrase groups were found together in the quoted passage.

Matched evidence tests: processor duty, security measures, Article 32 or security outcome.

Missing evidence tests: none.

Evidence 1. Paragraphs 5-6. coverage.

Exact extracted excerpt: “CONFIDENTIALITY AND SECURITY

Persons authorised to process the personal data are bound by an appropriate duty of confidentiality. The processor shall implement appropriate technical and organisational measures required for the security of processing under Article 32, including measures supporting confidentiality, integrity and availability.”

Source IDs: UK-DPA-01, UK-DPA-02.

Sub-processors - Uncertain

Article 28(2), 28(3)(d) and 28(4). Sub-processors require prior written authorisation, change notice and a chance to object; equivalent obligations flow down and the processor remains liable.

3 of 4 configured phrase groups were found together. The wording needs human review.

Matched evidence tests: change notice and objection, flow-down, liability.

Missing evidence tests: authorisation.

Evidence 1. Paragraphs 7-8. partial.

Exact extracted excerpt: “not appoint a sub-processor without prior general written authorisation. The processor shall give notice of any new or replacement sub-processors and give the controller an opportunity to object. The sub-processor shall enter a written agreement imposing the same data protection obligations. The processor”

Manual decision: Confirmed covered after review.

Reviewer note: Reviewed against the complete clause and related definitions..

Source IDs: UK-DPA-01, UK-DPA-02.

Data-subject rights assistance - Found

Article 28(3)(e). The processor assists the controller, where possible, with requests under Chapter III.

All 3 configured phrase groups were found together in the quoted passage.

Matched evidence tests: assistance, rights requests, measures or feasibility.

Missing evidence tests: none.

Evidence 1. Paragraphs 9-10. coverage.

Exact extracted excerpt: “shall assist the controller, insofar as possible, with data subject requests and the exercise of rights under Chapter III. Taking into account the nature of the processing and information available to the processor, the processor shall assist the controller with personal data breach obligations, data protection”

Source IDs: UK-DPA-01, UK-DPA-02.

Security, breach and DPIA assistance - Found

Article 28(3)(f); Articles 32 to 36. The processor assists with security, breach notifications, impact assessments and prior consultation, taking account of the processing and information available.

All 3 configured phrase groups were found together in the quoted passage.

Matched evidence tests: assistance, Articles 32 to 36 or duties, context.

Missing evidence tests: none.

Evidence 1. Paragraphs 9-10. coverage.

Exact extracted excerpt: “shall assist the controller, insofar as possible, with data subject requests and the exercise of rights under Chapter III. Taking into account the nature of the processing and information available to the processor, the processor shall assist the controller with personal data breach obligations, data protection”

Source IDs: UK-DPA-01, UK-DPA-02.

Return or deletion at end of services - Found

Article 28(3)(g). At the controller's choice, the processor deletes or returns all personal data and deletes copies unless retention is required by law.

All 4 configured phrase groups were found together in the quoted passage.

Matched evidence tests: controller choice, delete or return, all data and copies, law exception.

Missing evidence tests: none.

Evidence 1. Paragraphs 11-12. coverage.

Exact extracted excerpt: "END OF SERVICES

At the controller's choice, the processor shall delete or return all personal data and delete existing copies, unless applicable law requires storage."

Source IDs: UK-DPA-01, UK-DPA-02.

Compliance information, audits and inspections - Found

Article 28(3)(h). The processor makes compliance information available and allows and contributes to controller or mandated-auditor audits and inspections.

All 3 configured phrase groups were found together in the quoted passage.

Matched evidence tests: compliance information, audits and inspections, controller or auditor.

Missing evidence tests: none.

Evidence 1. Paragraphs 13-14. coverage.

Exact extracted excerpt: "AUDIT AND INSTRUCTIONS

The processor shall make available all information necessary to demonstrate compliance with Article 28 and allow for and contribute to audits and inspections by the controller or an auditor appointed by the controller. The processor shall immediately inform the controller if an instruction infringes applicable data protection law."

Source IDs: UK-DPA-01, UK-DPA-02.

Notice of unlawful instruction - Found

Article 28(3), final sentence. The processor immediately tells the controller if an instruction appears to infringe applicable data-protection law.

All 3 configured phrase groups were found together in the quoted passage.

Matched evidence tests: immediate notice, instruction, infringement.

Missing evidence tests: none.

Evidence 1. Paragraphs 13-14. coverage.

Exact extracted excerpt: "AUDIT AND INSTRUCTIONS

The processor shall make available all information necessary to demonstrate compliance with Article 28 and allow for and contribute to audits and inspections by the controller or an auditor appointed by the controller. The processor shall immediately inform the controller if an instruction infringes applicable data protection law."

Source IDs: UK-DPA-01, UK-DPA-02.
